The "IDO World HipHop Championship" is a "pure" IDO World Streetdance event with up to 28 categories in 5 days. There are many more adjudicators needed to ensure excellent judging and an optimum of fairness and professionalism towards the dancers from all continents.

7 judges total for all categories and age groups¹ in HipHop and Electric Boogie

3 judges will judge the break dance disciplines at each floor

The organizer will pay according IDO rules (travel, accommodation, meals and honorarium 5 days) for 7 "judge's seats".

This allows the participating countries to send more judges to share the privilege of judging at these important IDO World Championships in the **Halle 7** in Bremen, Germany.

Example:

Country XXX has one official judging place – XXX sends 6 judges, they share the seat divided like that: 2 judges each for the children, juniors and adults. (example!)

Complementary admittance to the VIP-area for the judging-day

All judges will receive vouchers for complimentary admittance of the VIP-area the day they are judging.

Because of too heavy use of the VIP-area during the last year this is strictly enforced to enable the IDO-judges who are judging on the day a "retreat" to relax and enjoy the event from the VIP-area before and/or in between their judging time.

Additional Voluntary judges are very much welcome and needed

Judges from countries who are not requested by the IDO Adjudication Committee to send judges, are very much welcome to send **voluntary judges**. The chairmen of judges will register all voluntary judges and distribute them on the various competitions, always trying to follow their special wishes and suggestions. But they **MUST** be enrolled until the deadline.

IDO official Judges Meeting(s)

The official IDO-judges Meeting will take place from
09:00 a.m. till 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, June 11, 2008
– unless otherwise published.

All judges MUST attend this meeting!

Ø If a judge will not participate at this meeting she/he cannot judge the competition.

Streetdance Meeting

All Judges are also requested to attend the IDO Streetdance Meeting on **Thursday, June 12, 19:00-20.00 h (07:00 pm – 08:00 pm)**

No household or family judging

IDO rules prohibit judges judging dancers from your household/family or dancers who you have trained. You are subject to loosing your IDO judging license if this rule is not honored.

IDO Judges License

All judges must have a valid IDO Judging License.

Application must be made through your National IDO Member Federation.

English language

According IDO Statutes the official language of the IDO is English.

Ø All judges must speak and understand English or have a proficient English interpreter with them all the times.

Please be aware

No teacher, coach or choreographer shall adjudicate any dancers from their own club or school or from the club or school in which they teach or a regular basis. Adjudicators are not permitted to judge any dancers they have choreographed for on personally taught, trained or coached at any time during the six (6) months preceding a competition. Judges so involved must ask to be removed from the judging panels concerned by informing the Chairman of Judges before or during the Judges Seminar.

This rule does not apply to dance educators who, on occasion, teach master classes, nor to the dancers who participate in such classes. The above mentioned proposal only applies for disciplines and categories where the competitors own music is used in the first round.
